# President's Message

---

As noted at the end of my last message, we started the month off with Craig Timmerman from Texas. His demonstration for us was even better than the one he did for the AAW Symposium. Craig demonstrated a winged bowl and made the process seem very easy, if you don't rush and follow his instructions. His instructions are on our Member Resource page and are very easy to follow. There is also a video of his demo on the MR page.

Several members of the Mendocino Woodturners Guild joined us for Craig's demo.

This will most likely be our last free demo. The survey we sent out showed that a significant number of the responding members would be willing to share the cost for professional demos.

There are no current professional demos scheduled.

Our future meeting demos include;

Log to Bowl ... BLANK on September 3, by way of Zoom. I will make the presentation, using a PowerPoint presentation. I will try to explain my thought process on where, why and how to make the cuts on a log. Then how to convert that '1/2' log to a blank ready to mount to a face plate or between centers.

On October 1, Ron Valley and Carl Bodenstein will talk about the basics of using carbide tools and scrapers.

November 5 is still open but Don Bradway is working on identifying the demo and demonstrator.

Riverview and Fairchild remain closed to our access. The Vet's Garage is in the process of moving from the E. Francis location to 224 E. Pacific, a couple of blocks from Division just north of the freeway.

At our Board of Directors meeting, a brief discussion was held about having CA glue be a stocked item in our 'store'. A decision was tabled until we re-start in-person meetings. Don Bradway will contact Eric Loftstrom about doing a meeting demonstration by Zoom in the new year. The Lend-a-Lathe program still has both lathes available.

The INW Woodturners are currently represented by 9 local members, and I think 3 from the Moscow Co-op at the Dahmen Barn (Union Town), through the end of the month. If you consider going, please call them first.
