President's Message

For a short month (February) we sure did fill it up with club activities. Ron Gooley, Don and Debbe Scott and I started the month off by going out to the Fairchild AFB Wood Shop and making some modifications to their grinder set-up.

Then Steve Whitford found an English Walnut tree coming down in Cheney. Ron Gooley got a call from a Spokane Symphony buddy about a neighbor with a Black Walnut on the ground. Then Professional Member (more about that later) Joe Vogrig called with a trailer full of more Black Walnut. All of this wood is now at Carl Bodenstein's waiting our first cutting of the year. The collection of the wood was completed by a variety of members including Steve Whitford, John Gay, Pete Ehrhardt, Sam Frazier, Jacob Calamia, Ron Gooley and Carl Bodenstein.

Our monthly meeting on February 6 was attended by a standing room only crowd of at least 54 members and guests including 2 Shop teachers and 2 students from Ferris High School, thanks to Ron Valley mentoring @ Ferris on a weekly basis. We also had 2 new members from Fairchild AFB, and 3 other guests. Carl has shared that we have picked up about 20 new Club Members in the last 3 months. The Bring-Back bag was taken by Dean VanDeLeest, who displayed an Emerging Bowl that he will add to his collection. Dan Chadwick and Don Bradway had an excellent demonstration of the many different ways to mount wood on a lathe.



On February 15, we had 18 Club members participate at our 3rd Saturday event. Several new, and longtime members brought tools that needed sharpening. Ron demonstrated various techniques (of course including the 40/40 grind) and had several of them sharpening their own tools under supervision. Ron Valley previewed, (our next demonstration) his fluting jig.



Continuing our busy month the Board meeting had 13 participants, an all time high number. In addition to confirming that Ron Valley will demonstrate (March 5) the fluting jig he has used on some of his bowls, we learned that Don Scott will demonstrate his method of turning a 'basket illusion' at our April 2, meeting.

The Board confirmed that we will continue our policy of having a \$20.00 fee for taking wood at our cutting session, and Carl will require a new Release of Liability from all cutting participants. The date for the cutting has not yet been identified.

The Board is considering having Alan Lacer demonstrate and give 'hands-on' classes in June, and Ashley Harwood has tentatively agreed to return in August.

The Board has decided to add a Professional membership for individuals that provide a unique service to our club, the first members being Tommy John (Riverview Wood Shop manager) and Joe Vogrig (Vogrig Outdoors - arborist).

The Inland Northwest Woodturners is a volunteer organization

- Assistant Librarian (~1hour)
- Wood Raffle Coordinator (~1 hour)
- Club Photographer (~1 hour per meeting or event)
